

Primary Care Strategy



- **Integrated system of person centred, full-service, quality, community-based primary and community care**
- **Team-Based Care provided through a mix of Full Service Family Practices**
- **Locally and collaboratively designed**

Primary Care Networks (PCN)

- Geographically based, locally planned, and coordinated systems of primary care
- Network uses team-based care to link between clinics
- Committee that expands as the network develops
- Team-based care to increase access for people



Work Underway – Primary Care Networks

Target is 85 PCNs by 2022/23 and 2023/24

59 PCNs in Implementation, 1,184 FTE Hired

- FHA: Burnaby, Fraser Northwest, Ridge Meadows, Chilliwack, Mission, White Rock South Surrey, Surrey North Delta
- IHA: Kootenay Boundary, South Okanagan Similkameen, Central Interior, Central Okanagan, East Kootenay
- VIHA: Comox Valley, Cowichan Valley, Oceanside, Western Communities, Saanich Peninsula, Victoria, Nanaimo, Campbell River
- NHA: Prince George, Northern Interior Rural, North Peace
- VCHA: Richmond, Vancouver, North Shore

Team Based Care (TBC)

- Central model for building diverse, collaborative and integrated team
- More effective response to increasingly complex primary and community care needs
- Informed by population-data
- September 2022 resource strategy will support primary care providers - four pillars – retain, recruit, redesign, and train

CYMHSU in
PCNs?*

- Diverse team compliments allow for efficient and effective care
- Unique funding and compensation models allow for smaller patient panels

Across BC

- 59 PCNs implemented; 52 (88%) with MHSU specific classifications
- Over 170 FTE MHSU-related staff have been hired
- 13 Foundry Centres open, 6 in development and 4 in planning
- Direct referral relationships between PCNs and Foundry Centres
- Collaboration with Ministry of Mental Health and Addictions to integrate Primary Care into existing and emerging services
- Connecting providers with Ministry resources specific to early childhood health (Babies Best Chance, Toddler's First Steps, the Child Health Passport)
